SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Churchill Transportation Company, a corporation (Churchill), possesses a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier for the transportation of specific commodities between named points in southern California, including the transportation of household goods between a point at the intersection of Foothill Road and San Jacinto River (north of San Jacinto), on the one hand, and Los Angeles and Los Angeles Harbor, on the other hand. The carrier also possesses a permit to operate as a household goods carrier between all points and places in the State of California.

The Commission notified Churchill by letter that there appeared to be a duplication of operative authority insofar as the transportation of used household goods is concerned. Churchill's attorney has informed the Commission by letter that the carrier desires that its certificate be amended to exclude the transportation of household goods.

In the circumstances, it appears and the Commission finds, that amendment of the carrier's certificate as requested would not

be adverse to the public interest. The Commission concludes that the carrier's operative right should be amended accordingly.

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier acquired by Churchill Transportation Company by Decision No. 39348 dated August 27, 1946, in Application No. 27767 is hereby amended by deleting "household goods" from the list of commodities transported thereunder.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
