BEFORE THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Application of the City of Livermore, California for a public grade crossing of Murrieta Blvd. over the Southern Pacific Company's Oakland-Elvas line and The Western Pacific Railroad Company's Oakland Pier-Salt Lake City line in the City of Livermore.

ORDER

The City of Livermore is hereby authorized to construct Murrieta Boulevard at grade across a track of Southern Pacific Company and across a track of The Western Pacific Railroad Company in the City of Livermore, Alameda County, at the two locations and substantially as shown by plans (Second Revised Exhibit "B" Filed March 29, 1968) attached to the application to be identified as Southern Pacific Company Crossing No. D-46.0 and The Western Pacific Railroad Company Crossing No. 4-46.7, respectively.

Width of each crossing shall be not less than sixty feet and grades of approach not greater than four percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72.

Protection at each crossing shall be by four Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B), with two of the signals placed on a median strip, and with the two signals at the shoulders of the roadway augmented with automatic gate arms. The two median signals may be augmented with automatic gate arms.

Applicant shall bear entire construction expense, also maintenance costs of each crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company and The Western Pacific Railroad Company shall bear maintenance costs of each crossing of their respective tracks between such lines. The maintenance costs of the automatic crossing protection shall be borne by the City of Livermore,

pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

The crossings shall not be opened to public use and travel until the protection ordered herein is installed and operative.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
