County Road across the Right of Way
of the Southern Pacific Company at
Main Street near Tustin.

O R D E R

The County of Orange is hereby authorized to alter Main Street (Crossing No. BM-522.2) across a track of Southern Pacific Company's Tustin Branch partly in the City of Tustin, Orange County, as described and substantially as shown in the application. The width of the crossing shall be substantially in accordance with the plans and grades of approach not greater than one percent.


Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by three Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B), located substantially in accordance with the plans attached to the application.




Construction expense of the crossing shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties or, if they fail to agree, by further order of the Commission. Maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails shall be borne by applicant. The Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines. Installation cost of the automatic crossing protection shall be divided equally between the County of Orange and Southern Pacific Company. Maintenance cost of the automatic crossing protection shall be apportioned equally between the county and the railroad, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
