O P I N I O N

Harry McKenzie Trucking Co., presently operating as a highway common carrier, requests that its certificated authority be amended by excluding therefrom the transportation of sheet iron or steel cans or covers, except when moving in mixed shipments.

It is alleged that transportation of said commodities is usually performed by contract carriers; that because of varying conditions, a filed tariff rate is impractical; and to retain the traffic which it presently handles, applicant has to be placed upon a competitive basis with permitted carriers.

After consideration the Commission finds that the requested authority would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Appendix A of Decision No. 58848 in Application No. 41230 is hereby amended by incorporating Third Revised Page 1 attached hereto and made a part hereof in place of Second Revised Page 1.

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2. After the effective date hereof and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall amend its tariffs presently on file with the Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
