ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHT

The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Perry A. Redwine, doing business as B & R Service Company (Redwine), has been suspended since February 14, 1967, for failure to have on file the required tariffs.

In investigating the status of this carrier, the Commission staff was informed by Redwine that he had sold his trucking equipment and business to J. E. Baker Trucking, that transfer of his certificate was not involved in the sale and that he has no intention of returning to the trucking business.

Perry A. Redwine having failed to have on file the required tariffs and having discontinued service as a petroleum irregular route carrier without proper authority, the Commission finds that such failures constitute good cause for revocation of the certificate.

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a petroleum irregular route carrier

granted to Perry A. Redwine, doing business as B & R Service Company, by Decision No. 49680 dated February 16, 1954, in Application No. 34809, is hereby revoked.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Perry A. Redwine or to mail a certified copy thereof to him at his last known address as shown in the Commission's records.

The effective date of this order shall be the thirtieth day after such service upon Perry A. Redwine or after the above mailing to him.
