O R D E R

The City of Galt is hereby authorized to construct North Lincoln Way at grade across a track of Southern Pacific Company in the City of Galt, Sacramento County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. DG-112.7.

Width of crossing shall be not less than forty feet and grades of approach not greater than two percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 3 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B) augmented with automatic gate arms.

Applicant shall bear entire expense of construction and installation of automatic protection, also maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines. Maintenance costs of the automatic protection shall be borne by the applicant, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

As a condition to the construction of said Ione Branch Line crossing, it has been agreed by the parties relative hereto that the B Street Grade Crossing No. D-111.3, located about one mile southwesterly, where B Street crosses Southern Pacific Company's Sacramento main line track in the City of Galt, will be abandoned

and effectively closed. Upon completion of the foregoing construction, said main line crossing No. D-111.3 shall be abandoned and effectively closed.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
