SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

United Expressways, Inc. (United), a corporation, holds a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier for the transportation of general commodities between various points in California including the transportation of used household goods between points in the defined Los Angeles Basin Area and points south of Vista (San Diego County). United has also been issued permits by this Commission to operate as a radial highway common, highway contract and city carrier.

Under the provisions of Section 5112 of the Public Utilities Code, the only authority required from the Commission by a carrier to transport used household goods is a household goods carrier permit, which type of authority United does not possess. The Commission notified United by letter of the aforementioned provisions and stated that, unless it received a reply from the carrier within a specified time, it would consider amending United's certificate by deleting therefrom the transportation of used household goods. To date no response has been received from the carrier.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that amendment of the carrier's certificate to exclude therefrom the


transportation of used household goods would not be adverse to the public interest. The Commission concludes that the carrier's operative right should be amended accordingly.


IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to United Expressways, Inc., a corporation, by Decision No. 61616 dated March 7, 1961, as amended by Decision No. 62218 dated June 27, 1961, in Application No. 42912, is hereby further amended by incorporating in Appendix A of Decision No. 61616 First Revised Page 2, attached hereto, in revision of Original Page 2.



United Expressways, Inc., shall render no service between any two points both of which are in the San Diego Territory.

In rendering service pursuant to paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of this appendix, applicant shall not transport any shipments of:

- a. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in Item No. 5 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-B;
 - b. New household goods, office and store fixtures and equipment not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in Item No. 5 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-B, between the Los Angeles Basin Area and Vista.
4. Between all points and places in the said Los Angeles Basin Area, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, San Luis Obispo, Stockton and the San Francisco Territory, as described in Appendix B attached hereto, via the following named and numbered streets and highways serving all points and places within five miles laterally thereof:
- a. U. S. Highways Nos. 101 and 101-A between Los Angeles and San Luis Obispo;
 - b. U. S. Highway No. 99 between Los Angeles and Stockton;
 - c. U. S. Highway No. 50 between its junction with U. S. Highway No. 99, and San Francisco.
