Application of the COUNTY OF MONTEREY, STATE OF CALIFORNIA to relocate Grade Crossing E-152.6 and construct a grade crossing on the proposed Greenfield-Arroyo Seco Road at Mile Post 153.7 across right of way of the Southern Pacific Railroad Company.

The County of Monterey is hereby authorized to construct Greenfield-Arroyo Seco Road at grade across a track of the Southern Pacific Company in Monterey County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. E-153.7.

Width of crossing shall be not less than 24 feet and grades of approach not greater than five percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 3 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B) augmented with automatic gate arms.

Applicant shall bear entire expense of construction of the crossing. Installation cost of the automatic protection shall be divided equally between the applicant and the railroad. Maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails shall be borne by applicant. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines. Maintenance costs of the automatic protection shall be divided equally between the applicant and the railroad, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

Upon completion, the crossing located at Milepost 152.6, about 1.1 miles northerly, shall be abandoned and effectively closed. Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall empire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revolved or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
