OPINION AND ORDER

A certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a freight forwarder was granted to Airways Parcel Post Service, Inc. doing business as Airways Air Freight (Airways) by Decision No. 73808 dated March 5, 1968. Paragraph 2(b) of the order in the decision reads as follows:

Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file tariffs, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.

The final date to establish the service and file tariffs was July 23, 1968.

By Petition for Modification filed August 5, 1968, Airways requests additional time within which to file its tariff and establish service. It also requests that tariff filings be made on ten days notice to the Commission and the public. The petition alleges that at the time of filing Application No. 49826, Petitioner, operating under highway carrier permit authorities, was performing store door pickup and delivery service for a major California air common carrier. Subsequently, this air carrier cancelled its contractual arrangement

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for said pickup and delivery service, making it necessary for Petitioner to reorganize its operations. In the meantime, the one hundred and twenty days within which Petitioner was required to file a tariff had expired. Petitioner is now anxious to inaugurate service and is ready to file its tariff promptly if the extension of time requested by this petition is granted.

The Commission having considered such request, and good cause appearing,

IT IS ORDERED that ordering paragraphs 2(b) and 2(c) of Decision No. 73808 are amended as follows:

- 2(b) Within one hundred eighty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file tariffs, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.
- 2(c) The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the service herein authorized.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
