ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHT

The certificate of public convenience and necessity acquired by Henry C. Espinosa, doing business as Resort Freight Lines (Espinosa), was suspended on May 16, 1967, at the request of Espinosa, to allow him time to rebuild his business. The certificate was further suspended on April 30, 1968, for failure on the part of the carrier to have on file the required tariffs.

In investigating the status of this carrier, the Commission staff was informed by Mrs. Henry C. Espinosa that for-hire transportation had not been performed for some time, that such transportation was not anticipated and that her husband is otherwise engaged in selling rock and sawdust to various nurseries.

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that revocation of the certificate would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that the certificate should be revoked.

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier acquired by Henry C. Espinosa by Decision No. 64116 dated August 14, 1962, as amended by Decision No. 74082 dated May 7, 1968, in Application No. 44442 is hereby revoked.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Henry C. Espinosa or to mail a certified copy thereof to him at his last known address as shown in the Commission's records.

The effective date of this order shall be the thirtieth day after such service upon Henry C. Espinosa or after the above-mentioned mailing to him.
