SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 74532 dated August 13, 1968, the Commission found that Distance Table 7 and its separate Book of Maps contain the reasonable constructive miles and governing rules to be used in connection with the Commission's minimum rate tariffs in place of Distance Table 6 and that the resulting changes provide just and reasonable minimum rates and rules. The Commission concluded that Distance Table 7 and its separate Book of Maps should be adopted to supersede Distance Table 6 effective January 1, 1969, and that minimum rate tariffs now referring to Distance Table 6 should be amended accordingly. The necessary amendment to Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 will be made by the order herein.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 (Appendix "A" of Decision No. 32566, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective January 1, 1969, Twelfth Revised Page 3-A attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. The basis for constructively increasing highway mileages prescribed by the Commission in Decision No. 74532 dated August 13, 1968, in Case No. 7024, is hereby adopted, established and approved as the just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory basis for computing distances for use in applying certain distance rates in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 7 for the transportation of lightweight aggregates.

3. In all other respects Decision No. 32566, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

610	<p style="text-align: center;">DEFINITION OF TECHNICAL TERMS (Items Nos. 10, 11 and 12)</p> <p>BATCHING PLANT means an installation (structure and appurtenant storage area) at which the ingredients for the production of concrete are received, stored, weighed, batched and subsequently transported therefrom.</p> <p>CARRIER means a radial highway common carrier or a highway contract carrier, as defined in the Highway Carriers' Act.</p> <p>COMMERCIAL PRODUCING PLANT means an installation (structure and appurtenant storage area) at which rock, sand, and/or gravel are processed as to size and/or grade and placed in stockpiles or bunkers.</p> <p>COMMON CARRIER RATE means any intrastate rate or rates of any common carrier or common carriers, as defined in the Public Utilities Act, lawfully on file with the Commission and in effect at time of shipment; any interstate or foreign rate or rates of any common carrier railroad or railroads applying between points in California by an interstate or foreign route, lawfully in effect at time of shipment; also any interstate or foreign rate or rates of any common carrier or common carriers, as defined in the Public Utilities Act, applying between points in California and in effect at time of shipment and covering transportation exempt from rate regulation of the Interstate Commerce Commission under Section 203(b)(8) of Part II of the Interstate Commerce Act.</p> <p>CONCRETE ARTICLE FACTORY means an installation (structure and appurtenant storage area) at which the ingredients of concrete are received, stored, weighed and batched, and concrete articles are manufactured therefrom on the premises.</p> <p>CONSIGNEE means the person, firm or corporation to whom the property is to be physically delivered by the carrier.</p> <p>CONSIGNOR means the person, firm or corporation from whom the property was physically received by the carrier for transportation.</p> <p>DEBTOR means the person assuming responsibility for payment of transportation charges. It also includes an overlying carrier when he utilizes the services of an underlying carrier.</p> <p>DIRECTORY means Southern California Production Area and Delivery Zone Directory 1.</p> <p>6 DISTANCE TABLE means Distance Table 7.</p> <p>DISTRIBUTING YARD means an area for storage of rock, sand, gravel, or cold road oil mixture (commonly called "plant mix") in piles, bins, silos or bunkers.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">(Continued in Item No. 11)</p>
