ORDER REVOKING HIGHWAY COMMON CARRIER CERTIFICATE

By Decision No. 45489 dated March 27, 1951, in Application No. 32133, Paul D. Thompson, doing business as Thompson Transportation Co., acquired a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier.

By Resolution No. R-183 dated December 19, 1967, in Application No. 32133, at carrier's request the certificate was suspended until December 19, 1968, unless sooner canceled, modified or extended by order of the Commission.

Paul D. Thompson has notified the Commission in writing, that due to poor health he will never be able to re-enter the business of being a for-hire highway common carrier. Thompson has disposed of all of his vehicle equipment, canceled his tariffs on file with the Commission and requests that his certificate be canceled.



The Commission finds that these matters constitute good cause for revocation of the certificate.

IT IS ORDERED that the certificate of public convenience and necessity acquired by Paul D. Thompson by Decision No. 45489, dated March 27, 1951, in Application No. 32133 is hereby revoked.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order upon Paul D. Thompson or to mail a certified copy to him at his last known address as shown in the Commission's records.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
