## OPINION AND ORDER

Minimum Rate Tariff No. 8 names minimum rates and rules for the transportation of fresh or green fruits and vegetables and related commodities by highway permit carriers. By this petition, California Trucking Association seeks general increases, with certain exceptions, in the minimum rates named in the above tariff. Petitioner asks that the tariff revisions be made effective January 1, 1969, and that common carriers be directed to establish in their respective tariffs such modifications as may be prescribed by the Commission's order in this proceeding, including relief from the long- and short-haul provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code.

The increases range from 1 to 6 percent. Petitioner's proposal also involves the establishment of a 42,000-pound distance rate scale and the cancellation of certain rates for transportation, which is in interstate or foreign commerce and is exempted from rate regulation by the Interstate Commerce Commission. The increases and other revisions are set forth in detail in Pages A-2 to A-5, inclusive, and A-7 of Exhibit A attached to the petition and Revised Pages A-1 and A-6 of Exhibit A, which revised pages are attached to the amendment to said petition.

Petitioner states that, since the last general revision of the involved tariff, the cost of transporting property by motor vehicle has increased. According to petitioner, increases in costs have resulted, and will result, from increases in wage rates and fringe benefits in substantially all categories of employees of highway carriers, including truck drivers, helpers, freight handlers and dock, maintenance and clerical employees. Petitioner alleges that increases will also occur in connection with employer payroll costs.

Petitioner avers that revision of Minimum Rate Tariff
No. 8 is required because of the adaptation of the tariff to the
new Distance Table 7<sup>3</sup> and because of a need to maximize technological improvements in carrier equipment necessitating the
establishment of new incentive rates.

The verified statement of petitioner's director of its divison of transportation economics, attached as Exhibit B to the amended petition, asserts that the increased costs which have occurred since the last general revision of the involved rates have had an effect upon carrier costs of operation which are in excess of the increase in rates sought by this petition. It is alleged in the verified statement that competitive marketing relationships mitigate against any greater or different form of rate adjustment and that any lesser relief would seriously impair the ability of the motor carrier industry to meet the immediate and foreseeable needs of shippers and receivers.

Petitioner declares that various interested parties, basically those previously described as the "Carrier-Shipper" group by the Commission, have discussed the proposed tariff changes and determined that they are reasonable and proper in the circumstances. Petitioner avers that such tariff changes would provide increases in almost all tariff items so that all involved would share proportionately in the rate increases.

Petitioner states that the proposed tariff revisions will be in the best interests of both shippers and carriers of produce and their representatives and asserts that the seasonal characteristics of the transportation involved and the desires of both shippers and carriers for a mutually acceptable effective date for such tariff changes necessitate expedited action in this matter.

Copies of the petition and amendment were mailed to various shippers and shipper associations on or about October 21 and 25, 1968, respectively. The petition and amendment were listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of October 23 and 29,1968, respectively. The Commission has received several letters from interested parties informing it that they support petitioner's proposal. No objection to the granting of the petition, as amended, has been received.

- 2. The tariff amendment established in Ordering Paragraph 1 hereof may also be established by common carriers in connection with the transportation of:
  - (a) commodities for which minimum rates have not been established, or
  - (b) commodities which are subject to higher rates than, or more restrictive provisions than, the minimum rates or provisions otherwise applicable.
- 3. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than January 1, 1969; and tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and

to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.

- 4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates and charges authorized hereinabove, are authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates and charges published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.
- 5. In all other respects Decision No. 33977, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty-four days after the date hereof.

DEFINITION OF TECHNICAL TERMS (Concluded)
(Items Nos. 10 and 11)

PRODUCE SERVICE SHIPMENT means a shipment, transported in one unit of equipment in one continuous movement not exceeding 48 hours in duration, consisting of one or more component parts delivered to, and/or received from, one or more consigned(s) or consignor(s) at one or more points of origin and/or destination. All shipping instructions and freight charges must be assumed by a single party when there is more than one consignee or consignor, and any oral shipping instructions must be confirmed by a single shipping document not later than 48 hours after final delivery. Applies only to truckload shipments subject to a minimum weight of 24,000 pounds or more.

RAILHEAD means a point at which facilities are maintained for the loading of property into or upon, or the unloading of property from, rail.cars or vessels. It also includes truck loading facilities of plants or industries located at such rail or vessel loading or unloading point.

RATE includes charges and, also, the ratings, minimum weight, rules and regulations governing, and the accessorial charges applying in connection therewith.

SAME TRANSPORTATION means transportation of the same kind and quantity of property and subject to the same limitations, conditions and privileges, although not necessarily in an identical type of equipment.

SHIPMENT means a quantity of freight tendered by one shipper on one shipping document at one point of origin at one time for one consignee at one point of destination.

SPLIT PICKUP SHIPMENT means a shipment consisting of several component parts, tendered at one time, received during one day and transported under one shipping document from (a) one consignor at more than one point of origin, or (b) more than one consignor at one or more points of origin, the composite shipment weighing (or transportation charges computed upon a weight of) not less than 4,000 pounds, said shipment being consigned and delivered to one consignee at one point of destination and, except as provided in paragraph 2 of Item No. 255, all charges thereon being paid by the consignee when there is more than one consignor.

SPLIT DELIVERY SHIPMENT means a shipment consisting of several component parts delivered to (a) one consignee at more than one point of destination, or (b) more than one consignee at one or more points of destination, the composite shipment weighing (or transportation charges computed upon a weight of) not less than 4,000 pounds, said shipment being shipped by one consignor on one shipping document at one point of origin at one time and, except as provided in paragraph 2 of Item No. 255, all charges thereon must be prepaid, and shall be billed to and collected from only one debtor.

TEAM TRACK means a point at which property may be loaded into, or upon, or unloaded from rail cars by the public generally. It also includes wharves, docks and lendings at which the public generally may receive and tender shipments of property from and to common carriers by vessel.

øUNIT OF CARRIER'S EQUIPMENT means one or more pieces of carrier's equipment (as defined in Item No. 10 hereof) physically connected to form a complete unit \*which may be lawfully operated over the public highways without special permit.

VEHICLE ICING means placing ice around or over the packages within carrier's equipment.

#### 1. Deductions

- (a) Rates provided in this tariff are for the transportation of shipments, as defined in Item No. 11 from point of origin to point of destination, subject to Items Nos. 130, 140 and 150.
- (b) Except as provided in Notes 1, 2, 3 and 4 hereof, when point of origin or point of destination is carrier's established depot, the pickup and delivery rates specifically named in this tariff shall be subject to the following deductions:

NOTE 2.-No deduction shall be made under this rule on shipments transported for persons, companies or corporations upon whose premises depots from or to which the transportation is performed are located.

NOTE 3.—Deductions made under this rule on split pickup or split delivery shipments shall be made only on the weight of the component parts having point of origin or point of destination, or both (as the case may be), at the carrier's established depots, subject to Note 2.

NOTE 4.—In no case shall the net transportation rate be less than 14 cents per 100 pounds, or less than the pickup and delivery rate, whichever is lower.

# 22. Deliveries Within a Single Market Area

For the purpose of applying the rates in this tariff, multiple deliveries\*, not exceeding six in number, will be permitted within a single market area as defined in Item No. 290 and shall be deemed to be made to one consignoe at one point of destination provided charges are paid by a single consignor or a single consignee.
