O P I N I O N

Decision No. 74515 authorized applicant City to construct "D" Street across the tracks of The Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway Company (Crossing No. 2U-1.1), prescribed automatic protection, and deferred allocation of construction and maintenance costs. The application contemplates that all costs and expenses, both as to construction and maintenance, are to be assessed to applicant City. This is consistent with Commission practice in applications for new crossings.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

Applicant, City of San Bernardino, shall bear the entire expense of construction of the crossing and installation of automatic protection at "D" Street Crossing No. 2U-1.1, also maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. The Atchison, Topeka and Santa Fe Railway Company shall bear maintenance costs of the crossing between such lines. Maintenance costs of the automatic protection shall be borne by the applicant, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
