O R D E R

In connection with the construction of Freeway 99E, the State of California Department of Public Works is hereby authorized to widen and alter the crossing of State Route 99E at grade with a track of Southern Pacific Company, identified as Crossing No. C-147.5, near the City of Yuba City, Sutter County, as described and substantially as shown by plans (Exhibits B and C), attached to the application. Width of crossing shall be not less than sixty feet and grades of approach not greater than two percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by four Standard No. 8 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B) augmented with automatic gate arms.

Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties or, if they fail to agree, by further order of the Commission.

The additional lanes shall not be opened to public use until the protection ordered herein is installed and operative.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
