DEFORE THE FUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

Application of the State of Californic
Department of Public Works for an order
authorizing construction of a crossing
at separated grades whereby State Route
50 will be carried over tracks of the
Southern Pacific Company, referred to
as CHIMO SPUR OVERNEAD and the relocation
of an existing crossing, No. BAB-517-9,
in the County of San Bernardino.

ORDER

State of California Department of Public Works is hereby authorized to construct a crossing at separated grades of State Route 60 to be identified as "Chino Spur Overhead" over the tracks of Southern Pacific Company and relocate the Walnut Avenue crossing at grade across the tracks of Southern Pacific Company approximately 200 feet southerly near Chino, San Bernardino County, at the location and substantially as shown by plans (Exhibit B and C) attached to the application to be identified as Crossing Nos. BAB-517.95-A and BAB-512.0, respectively.

Width of the Walnut Avenue crossing shall be not less than 32 feet and grades of approach not greater than 2 percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) augmented with automatic gate arms.

Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Company,

shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order.

Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.

Upon completion of the relocated Walnut Avenue crossing, the existing Crossing No. BAB-517.9, about 200 feet northerly, shall be abandoned and effectively closed. Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
