INTERIM ORDER

The State of California, Department of Public Works, is hereby authorized to reconstruct the crossing of West Main Street at grade with tracks of Southern Pacific Company, Crossing No. AE-85.0, in Woodland, Yolo County, as described and substantially as shown in the application. Width of crossing shall be not less than sixty feet and grades of approach not greater than one percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) augmented with automatic gate arms. The signal on the westerly side of the track is to be supplemented with additional light units mounted on cantilever arm.

Construction expense of the crossing and the installation of the automatic protection shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties or, if they fail to agree, by further order of the Commission. Maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails shall be borne by applicant. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines.

The parties are not in agreement as to sharing or apportionment of the maintenance costs of the altered and improved grade crossing protection and have agreed that maintenance cost of the automatic protection involved herein shall be apportioned by further order of the Commission, after hearing, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

The widened portion of crossing shall not be opened to public use until the protection ordered herein is installed and operative.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years unless time be extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
