O P I N I O N

Consolidated California Terminals, Inc., presently operating as a public utility warehouseman in the City of San Jose, requests authority to increase its certificated operation from 43,000 square feet of space to 120,000 square feet exclusive of the 50,000 square feet provided for by Section 1051 of the Public Utilities Code.

Applicant is presently conducting operations in a modern warehouse facility pursuant to a lease arrangement. The building has approximately 120,000 square feet of additional space that could be utilized for public warehouse purposes.

It is alleged that applicant has received numerous requests from companies located in the San Jose area to warehouse their respective properties in applicant's facilities; because of a lack of existing space applicant has been forced to turn down requests for warehouse space totaling more than 100,000 square feet; applicant finds that it is not in a position to offer a complete service to those existing and prospective customers to avail themselves of applicant's warehouse facilities under the existing space restrictions; and many of its customers have to store their properties on their own facilities.

As of December 31, 1968, applicant indicated a net worth in the amount of \$42,264. A copy of the application was served upon the California Warehousemen's Association. The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar on March 20, 1969. No protest has been received. The Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require that applicant be authorized to increase its warehouse space and therefore, the Commission concludes that the application should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Consolidated California Terminals, Inc., a corporation, as a public utility warehouseman, as defined in Section 239(b) of the Public Utilities Code, for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space as set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.
2. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations. Failure so to do may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.
  - (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. Applicant is placed on notice that, if it accepts the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, it will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of its operations.
3. The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in Paragraph 1 of this order shall supersede the certificate of

public convenience and necessity granted by Decision No. 59949, as amended by Decision No. 68091 and Decision No. 72573, which certificate is revoked effective concurrently with the effective date of the written acceptance required by Paragraph 2(a) hereof.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
