ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHT

The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted to Moses Meiselman, doing business as Mann Trucking Co. (Meiselman), has been suspended since December 2, 1968, for failure to maintain tariffs in effect. Western Motor Tariff Bureau, Inc., Agent, canceled from its tariffs the participation of the carrier on October 31, 1968. To date Meiselman has not filed the required tariffs.

Moses Meiselman having failed to have on file the required tariffs, the Commission finds that such failure constitutes good cause for revocation of the certificate.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier granted to Moses Meiselman, an individual, doing business as Mann Trucking Co., by Decision No. 53447 dated July 16, 1956, in Application No. 37726 is hereby revoked.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Moses Meiselman or to mail a certified copy thereof to him at his last known address as shown in the Commission's records.

The effective date of this order shall be thirty days after the date hereof.
