ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE RIGHT

Union Pacific Motor Freight Company, a corporation, possesses a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier for the transportation of less-than-carload shipments of property for the Union Pacific Railroad Company between points on the lines of said railroad in California west of San Bernardino.

Marshall W. Vorkink, attorney for Union Pacific Motor Freight Company, has informed the Commission by letter that the aforementioned operative right is no longer required by the carrier in the performance of its service to the public and requests that the certificate be revoked.

In the circumstances, it appears and the Commission finds, that revocation of the certificate, as requested, would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

The Commission concludes that the certificate should be revoked and the tariff applicable to the services thereunder should be canceled.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. The certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier acquired by Union Pacific Motor Freight Company, a corporation, by Decision No. 57127 dated August 7, 1958, and amended by Decision No. 74082 dated May 7, 1968, in Application No. 40280, is hereby revoked.
- 2. Union Pacific Motor Freight Company Motor Freight Tariff 3, C.P.U.C. 1, is hereby canceled.

The effective date of this order shall be thirty days after the date hereof.
