OPINION

By its order dated September 17, 1968, the Commission. instituted an investigation into the operations, books, records, accounts and business practices of Marjorie Duarte, formerly doing business as Oxnard Van and Storage, Joe F. Silva, Jr., Antoinette K. Silva and Oxnard Van and Storage, Inc.

A public hearing was held before Examiner Porter on January 15, 1969, at Oxnard, on which date the matter was submitted subject to briefs being filed. The time for filing of briefs having expired, the matter is now ready for decision.

The Commission staff presented evidence that the Commission in Case No. 6905, dated August 30, 1960, granted a prescriptive operative right as a public utility warehouseman to Marjorie Duarte, doing business as Oxnard Van and Storage.

After this grant, Marjorie Duarte did business through the corporate entity, Oxnard Van and Storage, Inc., without seeking Commission authority to transfer the warehousing right to the corporation.

Code. Marjorie Duarte violated Sections 851 and 1052 of the Public Utilities Code.

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. The prescriptive right of Marjorie Duarte as a public utility warehouseman is hereby revoked.
- 2. Marjorie Duarte, formerly doing business as Oxnard Van and Storage, Joe F. Silva, Jr., Antoinette K. Silva and Oxnard Van and Storage, Inc., shall cease and desist operating as a public utility warehouseman without proper authority from this Commission.
- 3. Warehouse Tariff No. 1, Cal. P.U.C. No. 1, of Marjorie Duarte, dba Oxnard Van and Storage, Inc., is canceled.

The Secretary of the Commission is directed to cause personal service of this order to be made upon the respondents. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the completion of such service as to each individual and corporation.
