O P I N I O N

The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company has requested authority to establish the Carbon Canyon Special Rate Area within the Placentia Exchange, Orange County, in accordance with Exhibits A & B of the application, to furnish urban grades of service at rates set forth in Exhibit C of the application and shown below, to withdraw suburban service within the special rate area, and to offer urban service outside the base rate area and the special rate area according to the rules in paragraph V of the application. A summary of present rates and proposed SRA rates follows:

Service will be withdrawn by December 31, 1971 in accordance with Commission Decision No. 74917, as facilities become available.

There will be no increase in monthly exchange rates to subscribers because there are no business suburban customers and two suburban residence customers (as of September 1968) will have an opportunity to reduce monthly exchange payment by taking measured service.

The special rate area covers approximately .49 square miles and includes 155 residence and business establishments including one elementary school, Edendale Christian Retreat, and Hollydale Mobile Estates. Further construction of homes in the vicinity is planned.

As of September 1968, applicant furnished service to 10 urban business services, 126 urban residence services and two suburban residence services within the proposed special rate area.

Applicant estimates that annual revenues would decrease by about \$9,500 after normal regrading. It appears that granting

the application will result in improved service and so it is in the public interest.

The Commission finds that a public hearing is not necessary and that such increases in rates and charges as will result are justified and that, for the future, present rates, insofar as they differ from those herein prescribed, would be unjust and unreasonable upon the establishment of the Carbon Canyon Special Rate Area.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph Company is authorized to establish the Carbon Canyon Special Rate Area as requested in the application.
2. After the effective date of this order, applicant is authorized to file with this Commission, in conformity with General Order No. 96-A, exchange maps revised to show the Carbon Canyon Special Rate Area within the Placentia Exchange with a boundary substantially as shown in Exhibits A and B attached to the application.
3. Applicant is authorized to file, in conformity with General Order No. 96-A, rates for service within the said special rate area, as set forth in Exhibit C attached to the application and rules, as set forth in Paragraph V of the application, and after not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to

the public, to make said rates effective for service coincident with establishment of the said special rate area.

4. Applicant is authorized to withdraw suburban telephone service within the Carbon Canyon Special Rate Area coincident with establishment of said special rate area.

5. The authorization to establish said special rate area granted herein, will expire unless exercised within eight months of the effective date of this order.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date thereof.
