SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

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By Decision No. 75797 dated June 17, 1969, as amended by Decision No. 75872 dated July 1, 1969, in the above proceeding, the Commission granted increases in the minimum rates and charges named in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 6-A for the transportation of petroleum and petroleum products, in bulk, in tank truck equipment by for-hire highway carriers. Such revisions in the minimum rates are scheduled to become effective July 26, 1969.

Through inadvertence, a tariff page was incorporated in Decision No. 75797 which does not fully reflect the authority granted by said decision.¹

In the circumstances, it appears, and the Commission finds, that the necessary correction should be made by the order herein. A public hearing is not necessary. The Commission concludes that Minimum Rate Tariff No. 6-A should be amended accordingly.

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The provision in paragraph 2(b) of Item 170 of Minimum Rate Tariff 6-A pertaining to the computation of charges for pumping service was inadvertently changed and will be restored to its former basis.

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IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 6-A (Appendix A to Decision No. 67154, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective July 26, 1969, Seventh Revised Page 17 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the second day after the effective date of this order on not less than two days' notice to the Commission and to the public and such tariff publications shall be made effective not later than July 26, 1969, and tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than the second day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than two days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff page incorporated in this order.

3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the amendment authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 450 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the amendment published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

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4. In all other respects Decision No. 67154, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
