O P I N I O N

Delta Lines, Inc., requests authority to extend its service as a highway common carrier to the Sequoia National Park area and points within the general vicinity thereof.

Applicant is presently authorized to transport general commodities as a highway common carrier to various points within the state including points within twenty miles of U. S. Highway 99.

It is alleged that the proposed extended area, which is beyond applicant's 20 mile lateral authority, has experienced a substantial growth as a result of an increase in recreational developments; that 547,300 persons visited Sequoia National Park in 1959, 654,100 persons in 1964 and 874,300 persons visited the Park in 1968; that there is no existing service to the proposed extended area and that the proposed extension will provide a desired and a needed service for the residents, businesses and visitors of the area.

The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar of June 11 and the amendment on July 2, 1969, respectively. No protests have been received.

After consideration the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the application. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Appendix A of Decision No. 62850, dated November 21, 1961, in Application No. 42431 is hereby amended by incorporating therein Fourth Revised Page 3 and First Revised Page 4 attached hereto and made a part hereof in place of Third Revised Page 3 and Original Page 4, respectively.

2. Within sixty days after the effective date hereof and on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, applicant shall amend its tariffs presently on file with this Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

27. State Highway 152 between Watsonville and Califa.
28. State Highway 198 between San Lucas and the junction of said highway with U.S. Highway 99 near Goshen.
29. U. S. Highway 466 between Paso Robles and Famoso.
30. U. S. Highway 399 between Ventura and Greenfield.
31. State Highway 166 between the junctions of said highway with U. S. Highway 101 near Santa Maria and U. S. Highway 99 near Wheeler Ridge.
32. State Highway 126 between Ventura and the junction of said highway with U. S. Highway 99 near Castaic.
33. Los Angeles Basin Territory as described in Appendix C attached hereto. (See Exception 1.)
34. U. S. Highway 395 between Los Angeles Basin Territory as described in Appendix C attached hereto and San Diego. (See Exception 1.)
35. State Highway 193 between junction of said highway and State Highway 41 (near Lemoore) and Lodgepole; and State Highway 276 between junction of said highway and State Highway 198 (near Three Rivers) and Mineral King.
36. Through routes and rates may be established between any and all points and places specified in paragraphs 1 through 35, inclusive.

EXCEPTION 1: Applicant shall have no lateral rights based on the boundary lines of Los Angeles Basin Territory.

EXCEPTION 2: Applicant is not authorized to serve any point on State Highway 140 east of Planada, on U. S. Highway 466 east of Edison, or on State Highway 29 between Napa and Lower Lake Road Junction.

Issued by California Public Utilities Commission.

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Applicant shall not transport any shipments of:

1. Used household goods and personal effects not packed in accordance with the crated property requirements set forth in Item No. 5 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 4-8.
2. Livestock, viz.: bucks, bulls, calves, cattle, cows, dairy cattle, ewes, goats, hogs, horses, kids, lambs, oxen, pigs, sheep, sheep camp outfits, sows, steers, stags or swine.
3. Petroleum or petroleum products in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
4. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
