Application of the City of Baldwin
Park to construct a public highway
across a railroad.Application No. 50855
(Filed February 3, 1969)ORDER

The City of Baldwin Park is hereby authorized to construct Virginia Avenue at grade across a track of Southern Pacific Company's Bassett Branch in the City of Baldwin Park, Los Angeles County, at the location described in the application to be identified as Crossing No. BBP-498.9.

Width of crossing shall be 40 feet and grades of approach not greater than three percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 8 flashing light signals (General Order No. 75-B) augmented with automatic gate arms.

Applicant shall bear entire expense of construction and installation of automatic protection, also maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Southern Pacific Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines. Maintenance costs of the automatic protection shall be borne by the applicant, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1202.2 of the Public Utilities Code.

The crossing shall not be opened to public use until the protection ordered herein is installed and operative.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within two years unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
