ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE

WHEREAS, the Petition of the City of Orange, a duly organized and existing municipal corporation of the general Law Class organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of California, and located within the County of Orange, State of California, requests that the Commission fix the just compensation to be paid by said city for the water system of Santiago Water Company, including certain lands, property and rights described in the petition, and sets forth the intention of said city to acquire, under eminent domain proceedings, such lands, property and rights; and

WHEREAS, said petition has been filed pursuant to the provisions of Division 1, Part 1, Chapter 8 of the Public Utilities Code, being sections 1401 through 1421 of said code, and is a petition of the first class as defined in Section 1403 of said code; and

WHEREAS, said petition names as owner of said water system, lands, property and rights, Santiago Water Company, a California public utility corporation, and said corporation has its local office at 136 Park Street, El Modena, California, and its main office at 121 North Exchange Place, San Dimas, California; and

WHEREAS, said lands, property, and rights are generally described as follows, to wit: the lands, property and rights more particularly described in that study entitled "Appraisal of Assets

of the Santiago Waler Company for the City of Orange, California", dated November 1965, prepared by Boyle Engineering, a copy of which study describing said land, property and rights of the Santiago Water Company is attached to the petition and marked Exhibit "B" and made a part thereof.

The aforementioned and described land, property and rights lie within that territory lying both within and outside the city limits of the City of Orange and which is commonly known as the Santiago Water system which territory is set forth on that certain map delineating the boundaries of the area served by said system, a copy of which map is attached to the petition and marked Exhibit "C", and made a part of the petition.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that said Santiago Water Company appear before Commissioner Fred P. Morrissey, or Examiner John M. Gregory, or such other Commissioner or Examiner as may be hereafter designated by the Commission, in the Commission Courtroom, State Office Building, 107 South Broadway, Los Angeles, California, at 10 a.m. on the 23rd day of September, 1969, and then and there show cause, if any it has, why the Public Utilities Commission should not proceed to hear said petition and to fix the just compensation to be paid for said lands, property, and rights; and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Secretary of the Commission cause to be served upon said Santiago Water Company a copy of this order certified under the seal of the Public Utilities Commission, to which shall be attached a true and correct copy of said petition, which service shall be made in the manner provided by Division 1, Part 1, Chapter 8, of the Public Utilities Code.
