OPINION AND ORDER

On February 27, 1969 Southern Pacific Company filed Application No. 50917 seeking authorization to abandon and remove stock corrals at Red Bluff, California. The Commission, having received protests to the proposed abandonment from various cattlemen, instituted an investigation into the efficiency and adequacy of the service, instrumentalities, equipment and facilities of Southern Pacific Company's stock corrals at Red Bluff.

By letter dated July 22, 1969, Southern Pacific Company advised that it has entered into a contract with a construction company to rehabilitate the stock corrals at Red Bluff in a manner satisfactory to the Cattlemen's Association and requests dismissal of the application and investigation. Another letter dated July 22, 1969 was received from the attorney for the Tehama County Cattlemen's Association requesting that the investigation instituted by the Commission be dropped subject to the withdrawal of the application by Southern Facific Company.

Therefore, IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Application No. 50917 is dismissed.
- 2. Case No. 8910 is discontinued.
