ORDER

As a part of its project to construct an atomic-powered electrical generating plant, the Sacramento Municipal Utility District is installing a one-mile spur line to provide rail service to the plant site during and after construction. In connecting with Southern Pacific Company's Ione branch line, a new crossing at grade with a State highway will be required. Southern Pacific Company acting for itself and the Sacramento Municipal Utility District requests authority to establish this crossing.

Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to construct a track at grade across Twin Cities Road, State Route 104 in Sacramento County, at the location described in the application, to be identified as Crossing No. DG-124.39-C. Construction of said crossing shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72, without superelevation and of a width as shown in the plan attached to the application, with tops of rails flush with the roadway and with grades of approach not exceeding two percent. Protection shall be by two Standard No. 3 crossing signals (General Order No. 75-B) augmented with automatic gate arms and supplemented with flashing light signal units mounted on cantilever arms.

Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto and copy of said agreement shall be filed with the Commission prior to commencing construction. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be extended or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require.

The effective date of this order shall be ten days after the date hereof.
