O P I N I O N

Strawberry Heights Water Company requests authority to sell its water system properties to the El Dorado Irrigation District.

Applicant presently furnishes water as a public utility in an area located in Kyburz, El Dorado County. A cash consideration of \$20,000 is to be paid for the system consisting of one river pumping station; a booster pumping station; two 50,000-gallon tanks; 8,400 feet of water mains and an unspecified number of fire hydrants.

It is alleged that the property owners of the Strawberry Heights Subdivision have recently annexed their land to the El Dorado Irrigation District.

After consideration the Commission finds that the proposed transfer is not adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. After the effective date hereof, Strawberry Heights Water Company may sell and transfer to the El Dorado Irrigation District the properties specified in the application.

2. Within thirty days after the consummation of the transfer herein authorized Strawberry Heights Water Company shall notify the Commission, in writing, of that fact and within said period shall file with the Commission a true copy of any bill of sale or other instrument of transfer which may be executed to effect said transfer.

3. Upon completion of the sale and transfer authorized herein Strawberry Heights Water Company shall be relieved of its public utility obligations.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
