O P I N I O N

Weber Truck & Warehouse, presently authorized to conduct operations as a public utility warehouseman in 180,000 square feet of space in Los Angeles, California, requests authority to transfer 70,000 square feet of authorized operations to Vernon, California.

Applicant has been conducting public utility warehouse operations since 1924 pursuant to prescriptive authority. It alleges that the new warehouse is located less than five miles from its existing warehouse and will enable applicant to better serve its present customers.

By letter dated September 19, 1969, the Los Angeles Warehousemen's Association informed the Commission that it has no objection to the granting of the application.

After consideration the Commission finds that the proposed transfer by applicant of 70,000 square feet of authorized public utility warehouse operations from Los Angeles to Vernon would not be adverse to the public interest and that public convenience and necessity require the operations of applicant as a public utility warehouseman in 110,000 square feet of space in the City of Los Angeles and in 70,000 square feet of space in the City of Vernon. A public hearing is not necessary. The order which follows will provide for the revocation of applicant's existing operating authority and the issuance of a certificate in appendix form.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Weber Truck & Warehouse, a corporation, as a public utility warehouseman, as defined in Section 239(b) of the Public Utilities Code, for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space as set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

2. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations. Failure so to do may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. Applicant is placed on notice that, if it accepts the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, it will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of its operations.
- (b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file tariffs, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.
- (c) The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the service herein authorized.
- (d) The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61-A.

3. Applicant shall comply with the regulations of the California Department of Public Health concerning hazardous or toxic

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commodities by including in its tariff a rule reading substantially as follows:

Hazardous or Toxic Commodities:

The warehouseman will not be required to accept for storage any commodity of a toxic nature which could contaminate other commodities in storage or be hazardous to the health of warehouse personnel. At warehouseman's option such hazardous or toxic commodities, when properly packaged and labeled to reduce contamination and health hazard to a minimum, may be accepted for storage in an area isolated from other commodities subject to contamination. Any additional services in the way of warehouse labor or excessive use of space arising from isolation of such commodities will be charged to the storage account.

4. Concurrent with the tariff filing required by ordering paragraph 2(b) hereof the prescriptive authority heretofore held by applicant is hereby revoked.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
