### OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. 76353, entered today in Case No. 5441 (Petition for Modification No. 154, as amended) et al., the increase in the East Bay Drayage rates named in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B, previously authorized by Decision No. 75516 of April 1, 1969 in this proceeding, was further revised. The decision also provided that Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B should be amended by separate order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution.

### IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B (Appendix B of Decision No. 65834, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective December 1, 1969, the revised pages attached hereto and listed in Appendix A, also attached hereto, which pages and appendix by this reference are made a part hereof.
- 2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject also to Decision No. 65834, as amended, are hereby directed to establish in their tariffs the increases necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein.

C. 5441, Pet. 154 ms 3. Common carriers maintaining rates on a level other than the minimum rates for transportation for which rates are prescribed in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B are authorized to increase such rates by the same amounts authorized for Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B rates herein. 4. Common carriers maintaining rates on the same level as Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B rates for the transportation of commodities and/or for transportation not subject to Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B are authorized to increase said rates by the same amounts authorized for Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B rates herein. 5. Common carriers maintaining rates at levels other than the minimum rates for the transportation of commodities and/or for transportation not subject to Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B are authorized to increase said rates by the same amounts authorized for Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B rates herein. 6. Tariff publications required or authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the tenth day after the effective date of this order, on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and to the public; such tariff publications as are required shall be made effective not later than December 1, 1969; and as to tariff publications which are authorized but not required, the authority herein granted shall expire unless exercised within sixty days after the effective date hereof. 7. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the rates authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now -2maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the rates published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.

- 8. Except to the extent granted herein, Petition No. 154, as amended, is hereby denied insofar as said petition relates to Minimum Rate Tariff No. 1-B.
- 9. In all other respects said Decision No. 65834, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty-four days after the date hereof.

SECTION 1--RULES (Continued) (1) ISSUANCE OF SHIPPING DOCUMENT A shipping document (either in individual or manifest form) shall be issued by the carrier to the shipper for each shipment received for transportation. The shipping document shall show the following information: (a) Name of shipper. (b) Name of consignee. (c) Point of origin. (d) Point of destination. (e) Description of the shipment (in terms of the Governing Classification or as provided in this tariff). (f) Weight of the shipment. (g) Rate and charge assessed. Such other information as may be necessary to an accurate determination of the applicable minimum rate and charge. 240 (i) For the transportation of (l) permit shipments, or (2) shipments requiring escort service, the following information, wherever applicable, shall be shown on all shipping documents issued by the carrier in connection therewith and shall be in addition to all other information required to be shown thereon: Permit identification of all permit shipments. (1)(See Item 10.) (2) Any escort service furnished and the authority therefor. (See Item 10.) The form of shipping document in Item 1100 will be suitable and proper. A copy of each shipping document, freight bill, accessorial service document, weighmaster's certificate, written instructions, written agreement, written request or any other written document which supports the rates and charges assessed and which the carrier is required to issue, receive or obtain by this tariff for any transportation or accessorial service shall be retained and preserved by the carrier, at a location within the State of California, subject to the Commission's inspection, for a period of not less than three years from the date of issue.
