SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. <u>75364</u>, entered today in Case No. 5432 (Petition for Modification No. 557), et al., authorized amendment of Minimum Rate Tariffs Nos. 1-B, 2, 5, 7, 9-B, 17 and 19 to cover transportation by dump truck carriers. The decision also provided that, in order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution, Minimum Rate Tariff 19 should be amended by separate order in this proceeding.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff 19 (Appendix "A" of Decision No. 41363, as amended) is hereby further amended by incorporating therein to become effective December 9, 1969, Fifth Revised Title Page and Seventh Revised Page 13 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

2. The rates, charges and rules set forth in Minimum Rate Tariff 19 are established and approved as the just, reasonable and nondiscriminatory minimum rates and charges to be assessed,

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charged and collected, and the rules to be observed by all dump truck carriers as defined in the Highway Carriers' Act for the transportation of mining, building, paving and construction materials, except cement or liquids, in bulk in dump truck equipment between the points for which rates are provided in said tariff.

3. In all other respects Decision No. 41363, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

This order shall become effective twenty-four days after the date hereof.

APPLICATION OF TARIFF--CARRIERS dRates provided in this tariff are minimum rates, established pursuant to the Highway Carriers' Act.
