O P I N I O N

M & M Transfer Company requests that its certificated authority as a highway common carrier be restricted against its transportation of commodities which because of their abnormal size or weight require the use of low-bed trailers.

It is alleged that applicant meets daily competition for the traffic involved from permitted carriers operating under rate exemptions as reflected in Item 40 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 and has experienced a decided competitive disadvantage in obtaining such traffic by virtue of its present rigid tariff structure. It is further alleged that applicant proposes to perform such transportation pursuant to its permitted authority.

After consideration the Commission finds that the requested authority would not be adverse to the public interest. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Appendix A of Decision No. 74392 dated July 16, 1968, in Application No. 48327, is hereby amended by incorporating therein First Revised Page 2 attached hereto and by reference made a part hereof in place of Original Page 2.

2. Within sixty days after the effective date hereof and on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public, applicant shall amend its tariff presently on file with this Commission to reflect the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

5. Liquids, compressed gases, commodities in semi-plastic form and commodities in suspension in liquids in bulk, in tank trucks, tank trailers, tank semitrailers or a combination of such highway vehicles.
6. Commodities when transported in bulk in dump trucks or in hopper-type trucks.
7. Commodities when transported in motor vehicles equipped for mechanical mixing in transit.
8. Logs.
9. Commodities of abnormal size or weight, which because of their abnormal size or weight require the use of low-bed trailers.
