O P I N I O N

Dart Public Warehouse, Inc, presently conducting operations as a public utility warehouseman in 1,100 square feet of space in the City of Vernon, requests authority to increase its authorized service by 30,000 square feet.

It is alleged that applicant's present facilities are filled to capacity and on occasions it has been forced to utilize aisles for the storage of merchandise.

Applicant has negotiated for the lease of a building immediately adjacent to its present location. The building contains 30,000 square feet of space and is of concrete tilt-up construction. As of June 30, 1969, applicant indicated a net worth in the amount of \$49,245.

The Los Angeles Warehousemen's Association has informed the Commission by letter that it has no objection to the granting of the application.

After consideration the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the application. A public hearing is not necessary.

Applicant's operating authority will be restated in appendix form.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Dart Public Warehouse, Inc., a corporation, as a public utility warehouseman, as defined in Sections 239(b) and 1051 of the Public Utilities Code, for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space as set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

2. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations. Failure so to do may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. Applicant is placed on notice that, if it accepts the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, it will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of its operations.
- (b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file tariffs, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.
- (c) The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the service herein authorized.
- (d) The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 51-A.

3. The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in paragraph 1 of this order shall supersede the existing prescriptive operating right now possessed by Dart Public Warehouse, Inc., which right is revoked effective concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph 2(b) hereof.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
