OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. <u>76562</u>, entered today in Case
No. 5439 (Petition for Modification No. 94) et al., revised exception
ratings for Pads, Sanitary, as described in Item 148960, Sub. 1 of
National Motor Freight Classification A-10, were established in
Minimum Rate Tariff No. 9-B. The decision also provided that said
tariff should be amended by separate order to avoid duplication of
tariff distribution.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Minimum Rate Tariff No. 9-B (Appendix A of Decision No. 67766, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective January 4, 1970, the revised pages attached hereto and made a part hereof by this reference, said pages being specifically identified as:

Third Revised Page 4 Fifth Revised Page 35.

- 2. Tariff publications authorized to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein shall be filed not earlier than the effective date of this order and may be made effective not earlier than the fifth day after the effective date of this order, and may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than sixty days after the effective date of the minimum rate tariff pages incorporated in this order.
- 3. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the ratings authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the ratings published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.
- 4. In all other respects said Decision No. 67766, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.
