ORDER EXTENDING TIME

By Decision No. 75130 dated December 20, 1968, the certificated authority of Signal Trucking Service, Ltd. to operate as a public utility warehouseman in the City of Long Beach and Wilmington was suspended until February 15, 1970. It is alleged that applicant is still in the process of procuring warehouse properties in said communities at rental rates which will permit it to earn a reasonable profit and applicant requests that suspension be extended to February 15, 1971.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The operating authority granted and acquired by Signal Trucking Service, Ltd. by Decision No. 53787 in Application No. 33761, Decision No. 57155 in Application No. 40113, Decision No. 44148 in Application No. 30967, as amended by Decision No. 53621, is hereby suspended to and including February 15, 1971.

2. Applicant shall amend its tariffs presently on file with the Commission, on not less than five days' notice to the

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Commission and the public, to reflect the authority herein granted.

The effective date of this order shall be ten days after the date hereof.
