> ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR PARTIAL DISMISSAL OF PETITIONS

Petitioner, the California Trucking Association, seeks revision of certain minimum rate tariffs to reflect application of

C. 5432 (Pet. 561) et al. ds

Motor Carriers' Explosives and Dangerous Articles Tariff 13, Cal. P.U.C. 8 of American Trucking Associations, Inc., Agent, and other related matters. Public hearing on this matter was held before Examiner Gagnon at San Francisco on December 2, 1969. A further series of adjourned hearings are scheduled commencing February 24, 1970.

On January 21, 1970, the California Fertilizer Association, protestant, filed a motion for dismissal of that portion of the petitions wherein the California Trucking Association requests that the class rates named in Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 be made applicable to movements of fertilizers, fungicides and insecticides which are required to be labeled under the rules of the aforesaid Dangerous Articles Tariff. Said commodities are now exempt from the minimum rate provisions of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2.

Protestant argues that (1) petitioner's exhibits show no justification for removal of existing minimum rate exemptions and (2) the testimony of petitioner's witness shows no justification for the removal of existing minimum rate exemptions. Protestant concludes, therefore, that it should not be burdened with the time and expense of presenting evidence in opposition to that portion of petitioner's sought relief involved herein.

The California Trucking Association's direct evidence in support of its requested relief in Case No. 5432 (Petition for Modification No. 561) et al., has been received in evidence. Upon careful review of such evidence, the motion for dismissal and replies thereto, we find nothing of record that would compel us to remove and/or further restrict the minimum rate exemption provisions presently contained in Items 40 and 41 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 for fertilizers, fungicides and insecticides. The motion for partial dismissal should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The motion of California Fertilizer Association, filed January 21, 1970, in Case No. 5432 (Petition for Modification No. 561) et al., is hereby granted.

2. The portion of petitioner's requested relief in Case No. 5432 (Petition for Modification No. 561) et al., pertaining to the removal and/or restriction of the established exemption provisions for fertilizers, fungicides and insecticides set forth in Items 40 and 41 of Minimum Rate Tariff No. 2 is hereby denied.
