O P I N I O N

By Decision No. 76437, dated November 18, 1969, in Application No. 51392, Dart Public Warehouse, Inc., is a public utility warehouseman conducting its operations in 31,100 square feet of space in the City of Vernon. Authority is herein sought to increase the authorized space by 48,900 square feet.

It is alleged that applicant had originally requested authority to operate in 80,000 square feet of space, exclusive of the 50,000 square feet of expansion permitted by Section 1051 of the Public Utilities Code, and that because of an apparent misunderstanding of its application only 31,100 square feet of space was authorized. It is further alleged that the additional space will permit applicant to accommodate the present needs of its customers and the expansion privilege will enable it to meet future requirements.

A copy of the application was served upon the Los Angeles Warehousemen's Association. The application was listed on the Commission's Daily Calendar. No protest has been received.

After consideration the Commission finds that public convenience and necessity require the granting of the application. A public hearing is not necessary.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that:

1. A certificate of public convenience and necessity is granted to Dart Public Warehouse, Inc., a corporation, as a public utility warehouseman, as defined in Section 239(b) of the Public Utilities Code, for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space as set forth in Appendix A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

2. Applicant shall comply with the regulations of the California Department of Public Health concerning hazardous or toxic commodities and shall include in its tariffs a rule reading substantially as follows:

Hazardous or Toxic Commodities:

The warehouseman will not be required to accept for storage any commodity of a toxic nature which could contaminate other commodities in storage or be hazardous to the health of warehouse personnel. At warehouseman's option such hazardous or toxic commodities, when properly packaged and labeled to reduce contamination and health hazard to a minimum, may be accepted for storage in an area isolated from other commodities subject to contamination. Any additional services in the way of warehouse labor or excessive use of space arising from isolation of such commodities will be charged to the storage account.

3. In providing service pursuant to the certificate herein granted, applicant shall comply with and observe the following service regulations. Failure so to do may result in a cancellation of the operating authority granted by this decision.

- (a) Within thirty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall file a written acceptance of the certificate herein granted. Applicant is placed on notice that, if it accepts the certificate of public convenience and necessity herein granted, it will be required, among other things, to file annual reports of its operations.

- (b) Within one hundred twenty days after the effective date hereof, applicant shall establish the service herein authorized and file tariffs, in triplicate, in the Commission's office.
- (c) The tariff filings shall be made effective not earlier than ten days after the effective date of this order on not less than ten days' notice to the Commission and the public, and the effective date of the tariff filings shall be concurrent with the establishment of the service herein authorized.
- (d) The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 61-A.

4. The certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in paragraph 1 of this order shall supersede the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted by Decision No. 76437, which certificate is revoked concurrently with the effective date of the tariff filings required by paragraph 3(b) hereof.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.

Dart Public Warehouse, Inc., a corporation, by the certificate of public convenience and necessity granted in the decision noted in the margin, is authorized to operate as a public utility warehouseman as defined in Section 239(b) of the Public Utilities Code for the operation of storage or warehouse floor space as follows:
