ORDER

The Los Angeles & Salt Lake Railroad Company and its Lessee, Union Pacific Railroad Company, filed Application No. 51652 requesting that the portion of Decision No. 72251 in Case No. 8373, Ordering Paragraph No. 2, concerning the installation of automatic grade crossing protection at Crossing No. 3B-3.10, French Avenue, on the railroad's Pasadena Branch in the City of Los Angeles be deleted. Decision No. 72251, dated April 4, 1967, ordered the improvement of protection at this crossing on or before December 31, 1969. Prior to that time, applicants requested and received Interstate Commerce Commission approval for abandoning that portion of the Pasadena Branch Line north of Milepost 3.10. Permission was granted by the Interstate Commerce Commission on September 26, 1969. The crossing was removed from service November 1, 1969.

IT IS ORDERED that Paragraph No. 2 of Decision No. 72251  
in Case No. 8373 be deleted.

In all other respects Decision No. 72251 shall remain  
in full force and effect.
