ORDER REVOKING OPERATIVE AUTHORITY

By Decision No. 67278 dated May 26, 1964, in Application No. 45660, San Mateo-Burlingame Transit Company was granted passenger stage operative rights authorizing service in and between the Cities of San Mateo, Burlingame, Hillsborough and Belmont; between San Mateo and Hayward; between Palo Alto and Candlestick Park; and for school pupils and employees in portions of San Mateo and Santa Clara Counties. During the month of November 1969, San Mateo-Burlingame Transit Company, without appropriate authority, discontinued the passenger stage service theretofore conducted by it pursuant to the foregoing described operative rights, and that since November 27, 1969, San Mateo-Burlingame Transit Company has had no evidence on file with this Commission showing adequate protection against liability imposed by law for payment of damage for personal injury or property damage, as required by General Order No. 101-C, and that Bernard E. Calkins, President of San Mateo-Burlingame Transit Company, by letter dated November 26, 1969 stated that his company does not have the financial ability to provide its liability insurance; therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that the passenger stage operative rights, created by Decision No. 67278 in Application No. 45660, are hereby revoked and all effective tariffs and timetables on file with the Commission in the name of San Mateo-Burlingame Transit Company are hereby canceled.

The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Bernard E. Calkins, President of San Mateo-Burlingame Transit Company, or to mail a certified copy thereof to Bernard E. Calkins at P. O. Box 1486, 390 Lang Road, Burlingame, California 94010, last known address as shown in the Commission's records.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date thereof.
