Application of Suisun Valley Water Company, a corporation, as proposed transferor, to transfer to the City of Fairfield, a Municipal Corporation, as proposed transferee, the water system and all assets of said Suisum Valley Water Company.

<u>OPINION</u>

Suisun Valley Water Company requests authority to sell its water system to the City of Fairfield.

The water system is located in the County of Solano and serves 36 customers. The agreed cash consideration is \$15,000.

After consideration the Commission finds that the proposed transfer would not be adverse to the public interest and, upon consummation of the transfer, that public convenience and necessity would no longer require applicant to serve within the area herein considered. A public hearing is not necessary.

<u>ORDER</u>

IT IS ORDERED that:

- 1. On or before September 1, 1970, Suisun Valley Water Company may transfer to the City of Fairfield the water system herein referred to.
- 2. Within thirty days after the consummation of the transfer authorized by ordering paragraph I hereof Suisum Valley Water Company shall notify the Commission in writing of that fact and within said period shall file with the Commission a true copy of any bill of sale

or other instrument of transfer which may be executed to effect said transfer.

- 3. On or before the date of actual transfer, seller shall return to customers any refundable deposits made to establish credit and shall refund main extension advances, if any.
- 4. Upon compliance with the conditions of this order, Suisun Valley Water Company shall stand relieved of its public utility obligations, and may discontinue service concurrently with the commencement of service by the City of Fairfield.
