SUPPLEMENTAL OPINION AND ORDER

By Decision No. _________, entered today in Case No. 5432, et al. the Commission found that various minimum rate tariffs should be amended to reflect the adoption of National Motor Freight Classification A-11 in lieu of National Motor Freight Classification A-10. The decision also provided that Minimum Rate Tariff No. 15 should be amended by separate order to avoid duplication of tariff distribution.

IT IS ORDERED that:

- Minimum Rate Tariff No. 15 (Appendix B of Decision No. 65072, as amended) is further amended by incorporating therein, to become effective June 11, 1970, Seventh Revised Page 4 attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.
- 2. Common carriers subject to the Public Utilities Act, to the extent that they are subject also to Decision No. 65072, as amended, are hereby directed to establish in their tariffs the amendments necessary to conform with the further adjustments ordered herein.

- 3. Tariff publications required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein shall be made effective June II, 1970, on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public and tariff publications which are authorized but not required to be made by common carriers as a result of the order herein may be made effective not earlier than June 11, 1970, and may be made effective on not less than five days' notice to the Commission and to the public if filed not later than August 10, 1970.
- 4. Common carriers, in establishing and maintaining the amendments authorized hereinabove, are hereby authorized to depart from the provisions of Section 460 of the Public Utilities Code to the extent necessary to adjust long- and short-haul departures now maintained under outstanding authorizations; such outstanding authorizations are hereby modified only to the extent necessary to comply with this order; and schedules containing the amendments published under this authority shall make reference to the prior orders authorizing long- and short-haul departures and to this order.
- 5. In all other respects Decision No. 65072, as amended, shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be thirty days after the date hereof.

SECTION 1--RULES

DEFINITION OF TECHNICAL TERMS

AIR MILE means a statute mile measured in a straight line without regard to terrain features or differences in elevation.

BASE OF OPERATIONS means the single point described in the written agreement which shall be a point at which the shipper will regularly tender freight to the carrier or will regularly receive freight from the carrier.

CARRIER means a radial highway common carrier, a highway contract carrier or a cement contract carrier as defined in the Highway Carriers' Act.

CARRIER'S EQUIPMENT means any motor truck or other self-propelled highway vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, or any combination of such highway vehicles operated as a single unit.

CHILLED TEMPERATURE CONTROL SERVICE means the service of providing protection against heat and maintaining the commodity at a temperature higher than 32 degrees Pahrenheit.

ADANGEROUS ARTICLES TARIFF means Motor Carriers' Explosives and Dangerous Articles Tariff 14. Cal.P.U.C. 9, of American Trucking Associations, Inc., Agent, including supplements thereto and reissues thereof.

ESCORT SERVICE means the furnishing of pilot cars or vehicles by a carrier as may be required by any governmental agency to accompany a shipment for highway safety.

FROZEN TEMPERATURE CONTROL SERVICE means the service of providing protection against heat and maintaining the commodity at a temperature of 32 degrees Fahrenheit or lower.

SCOVERNING CLASSIFICATION means National Motor Preight Classification A-11.

HOLIDAYS referred to in this tariff means New Year's Day, Washington's Birthday, Memorial Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Admission Day(1), Thanksgiving Day, the day after Thanksgiving(2), December 24(2) and Christmas Day. When one of the above holidays falls on a Sunday, the following Monday will be considered a holiday.

- (1) Applicable only in connection with Rate Bases "A" and "C" rates.(2) Applicable only in connection with Rate Bases "B" and "D" rates.

PERMIT SHIPMENT means a shipment which because of its width, length, height, weight or size requires special authority from a governmental agency regulating the use of hydrays, roads or streets for the transportation of such shipment in whole or in part.

RATE includes charge and also rules and regulations governing and the accessorial charges applying in connection therewith.

TEMPERATURE CONTROL SERVICE means the protection from heat by the use of ice (either water or solidified carbon dioxide), by mechanical refrigeration or by release of liquefied gases.
