OPINION

Western Freight Handlers, Inc. (Seller), requests authority to sell and transfer and Heavy Transport, Inc. (purchaser), requests authority to purchase and acquire the seller's certificate of public convenience and necessity (Decision No. 62703, dated October 17, 1961, in Application No. 43427, as amended by Decision No. 62749, dated October 31, 1961 in Application No. 43427). The parties also request authority to execute a temporary lease pending the transfer.

The seller has authority to transport:

- a. Construction, mining and logging machinery, equipment, materials and supplies restricted to shipments weighing 5,000 pounds or more.
- b. Commodities which by reason of size, bulk or weight require special equipment or handling, and materials, parts and supplies that are appurtenant to or a necessary part of such commodities.

between the following points, subject to the restrictions hereinafter set forth:

1. All points and places in or within 25 miles of the boundary of the San Francisco Territory.

The purchaser has authority from this Commission (Decision No. 52378, dated December 20, 1955 in Application No. 35946; Decision No. 67426, dated June 23, 1964 in Application No. 46630) to transport: a. Machinery, equipment, materials and supplies incidental to or used in the construction, exploration, development, operation, refining, production and maintenance of facilities for the discovery, development, production, or refining of natural gas, petroleum and petroleum products. b. Machinery and equipment of unusual size or weight. c. Property or commodities of unusual size and weight requiring use of special equipment. d. Building contractors' equipment. e. Grading and paving equipment. f. Electrical transmission equipment. g. Water well drilling equipment. h. Mining machinery and equipment. i. Fabricated structures, tanks and hangers. -4from, to and between all points on or within fifty road miles laterally of the following routes:

- U. S. Highway 101, 101 By-Pass and 101 Alternate, between the Mexican border and King City.
- T. S. Highway 99 between the Mexican border and Medera.
- U. S. Highway 6 between Los Angeles and Benton Station.
- U. S. Righway 395 between San Bernardino and Inyokern.

State Highway 127 between Baker and Nevada state line.

- U. S. Highway 466 between Barstow and Nevada state line.
- U. S. Highway 66 between Los Angeles and Necdles.
- U. S. Highway 70 between Los Angeles and Blythe.
- U. S. Highway 80 between San Diego and Winterhaven.

The agreed consideration for the transfer of the seller's operating rights is \$26,000, payable upon approval of the transfer by this Commission and the Interstate Commerce Commission (Exhibit A on the application). The parties also request authority for the seller to lease to the purchaser pending final approval by this Commission and the Interstate Commerce Commission of the transfer, the seller's operating authority for the sum of \$200 per month, said sum to be deducted from the total purchase price of \$26,000.

^{1/} It is alleged that the seller's authority has been registered with the Interstate Commerce Commission.

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The application shows that as of June 30, 1969, the purchaser had a net worth of \$278,389.

The reason for the request for authority to temporarily lease the seller's authority is founded in its adverse financial condition which, the seller believes, makes it imperative that interim relief be granted to forestall further losses and ultimate bankruptcy proceedings. For the first six months of 1969 the seller had an operating loss of \$47,785.

The applicants allege that approval of the within proposed transaction is in the public interest in that it will preserve to the public a needed common carrier service which will be strengthened and improved by the financial resources of transferee. They further allege that approval will have no adverse effect to the public or any other common carrier in that the transferee proposes to adopt the rates and charges named in transferror's present tariff.

After consideration the Commission finds that the proposed sale is not adverse to the public interest. Authority to lease the certificate as requested will be granted.

The authorization herein granted shall not be construed as a finding of the value of the rights herein authorized to be transferred. A public hearing is not necessary.

Heavy Transport, Inc., is hereby placed on notice that operative rights, as such, do not constitute a class of property which may be capitalized or used as an element of value in rate fixing for any amount of money in excess of that originally paid to the State as the consideration for the grant of these rights. The tariff filings made pursuant to this order shall comply in all respects with the regulations governing the construction and filing of tariffs set forth in the Commission's General Order No. 80-A. Failure to comply with and observe the provisions of General Order No. 80-A may result in a cancellation of the authority to purchase and acquire granted by this decision.

- 4. On or before the end of the third month after the consummation of the transfer as herein authorized, purchaser shall cause to be filed with the Commission, in such form as the Commission may prescribe, an annual report, or reports, related to the operations of the seller for the period commencing with the first day of the current year to and including the effective date of the transfer.
- 5. Within thirty days after the transfer herein authorized is consummated, purchaser shall file a written acceptance of the certificate. Purchaser is placed on notice that, if it accepts such certificate, it will be required, among other things, to comply with and observe the safety rules of the California Highway Patrol and the insurance requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 100-E.
- 6. Purchaser shall maintain its accounting records on a calendar year basis in conformance with the applicable Uniform System of Accounts or Chart of Accounts as prescribed or adopted by this Commission and shall file with the Commission, on or before March 31 of each year, an annual report of its operations in such form, content, and number of copies as the Commission, from time to time, shall prescribe.

- 7. Purchaser shall comply with the requirements of the Commission's General Order No. 84-Series for the transportation of collect on delivery shipments. If purchaser elects not to transport collect on delivery shipments, it shall make the appropriate tariff filings as required by the General Order.
- 8. Authority to lease the seller's operating rights to the purchaser for the sum of \$200 per month, pending completion of the authorized transfer, is granted.
