Investigation on the Commission's own motion into the operations, rates, charges, and practices of STEEL TRANSPORT, INC., a California corporation, and KAISER STEEL CORP., a California corporation.

SECOND ORDER EXTENDING TIME

Respondent, Steel Transport, Inc., has requested, in writing, another extension of time within which to comply with the provisions of ordering paragraph 1 of Decision No. 76280, in Case No. 8869. The first extension, which expires June 30, 1970, was granted to enable respondent's attorney to prepare a complaint against Kaiser Steel Corporation for the collection of undercharges.

It is alleged that such complaint was filed in the Superior Court and that Steel Transport, Inc. and Kaiser Steel Corporation presently are trying to settle the case. After agreement is reached as to an appropriate settlement it must be presented to this Commission for approval. It is alleged that Steel Transport, Inc., has insufficient funds of its own to pay the fine imposed by Decision No. 76280 (\$8,588.81) and must collect the undercharges from Kaiser Steel Corporation to be able to do so.

Conclusion of this settlement is not expected by June 30, 1970, so it is requested that the time to comply with said decision be extended to December 31, 1970 or to within 10 days of the collection of the undercharges, if this should occur first.

It appears that the relief sought is reasonable; therefore,
IT IS ORDERED that the time for compliance with ordering
paragraph 1 of Decision No. 76280, in the above entitled proceeding,
is extended to December 31, 1970, subject to the condition that the
fine imposed by said decision shall be paid within ten days after
the collection of the undercharges set forth therein, should that
occur prior to the extended date for compliance.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
