ORDER EXTENDING INTERIM FARES

Decision No. 76885, dated March 3, 1970, in this proceeding, granted Air California an emergency interim increase in fares, pending further review by the Commission. Said interim fares are scheduled to expire on July 16, 1970. Public hearing on Air California's request that the interim fares be made permanent is scheduled for June 29, 1970.

By Petition filed June 24, 1970, Air California alleges that the Commission will not have time to consider and act on its request for permanent fares prior to the scheduled expiration date of the interim fares, and requests that said interim fares be authorized to be maintained by it until the effective date of the Commission's final decision in the application herein.

The Commission finds that the proposed extension of the interim fares authorized by Decision No. 76885 will be reasonable, and the Petition should be granted.
