## FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

By Decision No. 77124, dated April 21, 1970, the City of Pittsburg was granted authority to construct two crossings at grade across railroad trackage in the former Camp Stoneman area in the City of Pittsburg.

By correspondence dated April 29, 1970, Southern Pacific Transportation Company requests that as the railroad does not own the trackage the decision should be-modified.

Investigation having been made by the Commission staff, it appears that the railroad's request should be granted.

IT IS ORDERED that the first paragraph of Decision No. 77124 is modified to read:

City of Pittsburg is hereby authorized to construct two crossings at grade across tracks operated over by the Southern Pacific Transportation Company in the City of Pittsburg, Contra Costa County, at the locations described in the application to be identified and protected as follows:

The fourth paragraph of Decision No. 77124 appearing on Page 2 is modified to read:

Applicant shall bear entire expense of construction and installation of automatic protection, also maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails. Maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines shall be by agreement between the parties.

In all other respects Dec. No. 77124 shall remain in full "force and effect except that time limit within which applicant may
