DOMINGUEZ WATER CORPORATION, a California corporation,

for authorization to increase its rates for water service to offset the increased cost of purchased water and the loss of the investment tax credit.

Application No. 51877 (Filed May 1, 1970)

OPINION AND ORDER

Decision No. 74833, dated October 15, 1968, in Application No. 49793 established rates for applicant's general metered and irrigation services. Decision No. 76333, dated October 28, 1969, in Application No. 51066, granted applicant authority to increase such rates to offset the increased cost of purchased water. The rates authorized by Decisions Nos. 74833 and 76333 each contained a provision that "until the 10 percent surcharge to federal income tax is removed, bills computed under the above tariff will be increased by 1.11 percent." The federal surtax was reduced to 5 percent on January 1, 1970 and terminated June 30, 1970.

By this application applicant seeks authority to increase rates for water service (1) of offset the increased cost of water it secures from the West Basin Municipal Water District (District), an agency of the Metropolitan Water District, and (2) to compensate for increased income taxes resulting from the cancellation of the investment tax credit.

The applicant alleges that it has been advised that on July 1, 1970, the cost of water purchased from the District will be increased by \$4.00 per acre foot for softened and filtered water and \$1.00 per acre foot for irrigation water. Applicant estimated that its purchased water costs, based upon year 1969 quantities purchased, will increase by \$90,240. It further alleges that it will receive an increased allowance of \$3.00 per acre foot for that portion of its Central Basin Exchange Pool pumped water it releases to other purposes. This credit will amount to \$1,824, giving applicant a net increase of \$88,416 in 1970 over 1969 in the cost of purchased water (Table No. 1 Exhibit B of application).

The rates auchorized by Decision No. 74833 (and Decision No. 76333) allow for an investment tax credit of \$25,000, pursuant to the then (1968 and 1969) effective federal statutes. The investment tax credit has been cancelled. Applicant requests an adjustment in rates to reflect this change.

Copies of the application were served in accordance with the Commission's rules of procedure. The Commission's staff has reviewed and analyzed the application and prepared a report thereon which is filed herein as Exhibit No. 1.

Applicant has proposed to increase its rates to compensate for the increased cost of water and loss of the investment tax credit as follows:

The requested increases will add approximately 11 cents per month to the average residential user who consumes 1,500 cubic feet of water per month.

The staff exhibit shows that the proposed rate increase will offset the increased cost of water to applicant and the loss of the investment tax credit, and that the earnings which will be produced under the conditions set forth in the application herein considered will not exceed the rate of return heretofore found reasonable for the applicant. The staff recommends that the proposed rate increase be authorized.

Findings and Conclusions

The Commission finds that:

- 1. Applicant is in need of increased revenues to offset increases in costs of purchased water and increases in federal income taxes resulting from the revocation of the investment tax credit.
- 2. Applicant's estimate of the revenue increase required to offset the future effect of the increased costs of water and the effect of the change in the tax laws is reasonable.
- 3. The increases in rates and charges authorized herein are justified; the rates and charges authorized herein are reasonable and the present rates and charges insofar as they differ from those prescribed herein are for the future unjust and unreasonable.

A public hearing is not necessary.

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We conclude that the application should be granted and that the order herein should be effective immediately; therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Dominguez Water Corporation is authorized to file after the effective date of this order, the revised rate schedules attached to this order as Appendix A. Such filing shall comply with General Order No. 96-A. The effective date of the revised schedules shall be four days after the date of filing and they shall apply only to service rendered on and after the effective date.
