Application of the State of California, Department of Public Works, for an order authorizing the construction of a crossing at separated grades, whereby the Shasta Main Line Track of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company will be carried over State Highway Route 5 on new alignment and remove the existing Antler Underpass in Shasta County. The new Underpass will continue to be referred to as the Antler Underpass.

ORDER

The State of California Department of Public Works is hereby authorized to relocate a crossing at separated grades of State Route 5 on a new track alignment under the track of Southern Pacific Transportation Company, near Antler, Shasta County, at the location and substantially as shown by plans (Exhibit E) attached to the application, to be identified as Crossing No. C-284.2-B, (Antler Underpass) and upon completion of the relocated underpass, to remove the existing Antler Underpass. Construction and maintenance expense shall be borne in accordance with an agreement to be entered into between the parties relative thereto, and copy of said agreement, together with plans of said crossing approved by Southern Pacific Transportation Company, shall be filed with the Commission within 180 days from the date hereof. Should the parties fail to agree, the Commission will apportion the cost of construction and maintenance by further order. Clearances shall conform to the provisions of General Order No. 26-D.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within three years unless time be extended or if conditions are not complied with. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
