## ORDER OF REVOCATION

Feather River Railway Company, a corporation, was granted a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier as defined in Section 213 of the Public Utilities Code over irregular routes between Feather Falls and Croville for general commodities subject to certain exclusions, by Decision No. 70932 dated July 1, 1965, in Application No. 42398.

R. B. Pamplin, President of Feather River Railway Company, has by letter advised the Commission that it intends to cease such operation and abandon its operative authority effective July 1, 1970.

In the circumstances, it appears and the Commission finds that the certificate of public convenience and necessity referred to above has been abandoned and should be revoked and the tariffs applicable to the services thereunder should be canceled.

## IT IS ORDERED that:

1. The certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate as a highway common carrier acquired by Feather River Rail-way Company, a corporation, by Decision No. 70932 dated July 1, 1966, in Application No. 48398 is hereby revoked.

- 2. Feather River Railway Company Local Freight Tariff No. 1-A, Cal.P.U.C. (Highway Series) No. 1, is hereby canceled.
- 3. The Secretary is directed to cause service of a certified copy of this order to be made upon Feather River Railway Company or to mail a certified copy thereof to it at its last known address as shown in the Commission's records.

This order shall become effective twenty days after the date hereof.
