**ORDER**

The City of Sebastopol is hereby authorized to widen the crossing of South Main Street and Petaluma Avenue at grade with tracks of the Petaluma and Santa Rosa Railroad Company, identified as Crossing No. 67-16.1 in the City of Sebastopol, Sonoma County, as described and substantially as shown in the application. Width of crossing shall be as shown on plans attached to the application and grades of approach not greater than one percent. Construction shall be equal or superior to Standard No. 2 of General Order No. 72. Protection shall be by two existing Standard No. 1 crossing signs (General Order No. 75-B) reflectorized with reflex-reflective sheet material.

Construction expense of the crossing shall be borne in accordance with an agreement entered into between the parties or, if they fail to agree, by further order of the Commission. Maintenance cost of the crossing outside of lines two feet outside of rails shall be borne by applicant. The Petaluma and Santa Rosa Railroad Company shall bear maintenance cost of the crossing between such lines.

Within thirty days after completion pursuant to this order, applicant shall so advise the Commission in writing. This authorization shall expire if not exercised within one year unless time be

extended, or if above conditions are not complied with. Authorization may be revoked or modified if public convenience, necessity, or safety so require. The effective date of this order shall be twenty days after the date hereof.
